



Civil Troika: Mexico, Russia, and Australia

In order to monitor the implementation of existing agreements and to ensure further progress in the G20's target areas, the Managing Troika was established. It is composed of countries that were last year's, this year's and next year's G20 presidency. Thus, the Managing Troika's composition changes every year.

In 2012, the G20 presidency and summit host was Mexico, from which Russia took the baton. Next in line is Australia, where the G20 summit will be held in 2014. Accordingly, the Managing Troika is now Mexico, Russia, and Australia.

However, as G20 presidency, Russia took this further and was the first to apply this organizational-management mechanism to the Civil20.

The last pre-summit meeting of the Civil Troika was in April this year, although the Troika's heads are constantly in ongoing interaction. The Managing Troika's countries play a key role in finalizing the text of the G20 recommendations.
